




Nico Smeenk studies industrial design at the 'Technische Universiteit' of Delft, Holland. As part of these studies, in 1983 he does a stage in the studio of **Andries & Hiroko van Onck** in Milan, where he collaborates on the design of the folding step 'Step' for **Magis**. In 1985, after his degree, he settles definitively in Milan. He works until 1991 with studio van Onck, designing - among many other products - electrodomestic appliances for **Zanussi/Elettrolux**, furniture pieces for Magis and **Kartell**, electronic equipment for **Pantec and Amplivox**. From 1991 to 1995 he is senior designer in **Design Continuum Italia**, operating mainly in the electro-medical sector (Boehringer Mannheim, Haemonetics). After two years as in-house designer in **Girmi**, where he works with **Luca Meda** on the design of a series of small electrodomestic appliances, he founds his own studio in 1998. The studio has since designed products for numerous clients in different sectors: Acea Manodomeistici, Indecasa, Cla hospital, Cefla, Geca, ACI Farfisa, Kimaldi, Famatel.

In 1994 he starts teaching design methodology at the "ISIA" in Rome and from 1998 onwards he teaches industrial design at the **Istituto Europeo** in Milan.


